GALATIANS 1:11-24

Paul is concerned that the Galatians are turning away from the Gospel and following teachings that are causing them to rely on their own good works, rather than the grace of God for their salvation. His message is simple: Jesus gave his life for our sins, just as God the Father planned, in order to rescue us from this evil world in which we live. (Galatians 1:4). In this passage Paul uses his own story to highlight God's grace.
